
LOGLINE

A traumatized man is convinced someone is trying to poison him, so his skeptical wife forces him to face his nightmares head-on with exposure therapy.

SYNOPSIS

Years ago, Tanner (Douglas Smith; *Don't Worry Darling*, *Big Little Lies*, *Big Love*) was kidnapped, tortured, and poisoned by an unknown assailant. After being inexplicably let go, he was left obsessed with the idea that his kidnapper was still out to get him. Day in and day out, his compulsive checking to confirm that his house is secure and his food is safe to eat slowly erodes his relationship with his patient and caring wife, Nicole (Margo Harshman; *NCIS*, *The Big Bang Theory*, *Even Stevens*).

One day, Nicole hears that the man who did this to Tanner was released from prison earlier than expected, and Tanner's obsession spirals out of control. To save her marriage, Nicole forces him to face his fears head-on with exposure therapy. Reluctant at first, he takes to it well—and perhaps to a dangerous level.



DIRECTOR'S STATEMENT

I've dealt with obsessive compulsive disorder for over a decade. Over the years, the media has served up an oversimplified version of OCD to the average person—one that downplays the relentless terror that plagues 1% of the entire population. *Exposure* takes the intricacies, nuances, and forms the disorder takes, and presents them in the way a sufferer all too often experiences it, so that those who don't can better understand.

The story shows OCD in a few of its many incarnations, all with the unifying factor of a specific, repetitive, mind-consuming fear. It can show up from trauma, or simply by itself. It can be brought about from drug addiction, or the other way around. Sometimes the themes make sense. Others seem laughably far-fetched. It's all under the same umbrella of obsession.

Despite its intensity, it's a phenomenon that isn't far removed from the fear and anxiety responses that everyone experiences. Because of this, the story can still be relatable. The best tool in addressing it, called exposure response prevention therapy, is surprising in how simple and intuitive it is. The fear is stimulated in a controlled environment, without compulsions or avoidance, until the power it holds is gone. It's that easy and that horrible.

Unfortunately, the alternative of ignoring it is worse. The consequences of untreated OCD go beyond the person dealing with it. Even the closest of relationships can be eroded after years of emotional burdens, financial sacrifices, and dwindling energy. The common saying that "mental illness is not your fault, but it is your responsibility" is something many of us had to learn in a bitter way. Emotional limits exist, and nobody can or should be blamed for them.

The ultimate goal for any sufferer of obsessions is the acceptance of a difficult truth: their "worst fear" can absolutely happen, and to keep living is to tolerate that. Underneath the suspense, drama, and horror, *Exposure* is about a man who learns that clinging to safety can ruin his life just as much as any perceived threat could. It's an idea that can make sense to anybody, but internalizing it is a steep ask for the average person, let alone someone tormented by this disorder.



Jordan knew from a young age she wanted to be a filmmaker; be it making funny shorts with her friends using her mom's old camcorder, or convincing her teachers to let her show a topical homemade film instead of giving a presentation in class. Despite financial insecurities, she put herself through her first year of college at the University of Minnesota and then was able to transfer out east to Emerson College.

Having worked in the entertainment industry since graduating with a BA in 2014, Jordan has produced a handful of short films ("End Times," "Kate in Oxnard"),



4 feature films (*Newly Single, Brut Force, Diary of A Spy*, and now *Exposure*), dozens of commercials for major brands (Kellog, Chase, iRobot, Fitbit, etc), and traveled the world to do so. Now, like many other millennials, Jordan finds comfort at home in Los Angeles with her rescue cat while looking for the next inspiring story to help tell.

MEET THE CREW

TANNER SAWITZ PRODUCER

Tanner graduated from Chapman University with a desire to write things for the big screen. Soon after, he discovered a love for figuring out just how those things were made, from budgeting to logistics on set. He began coordinating and production managing, stepping away from Final Draft to start his own production company, Leviathan Filmworks, in 2017. Tanner has production managed and produced for companies and artists such as Google, Facebook, Toyota, Coldplay, P!nk, and Kaiser Permanente, among many others. He believes that solid communication and efficient



collaboration are the keys to a good production. He currently lives in Simi Valley, California with his wife and giant German shepherd, producing everything from commercials to music videos. In his off hours, he moonlights as a ceramicist, doing art shows all around California.

MICHELLE KWONG DIRECTOR OF PHOTOGRAPHY

Michelle Kwong is a native New York cinematographer now based in Los Angeles. Her passion for visual imagery stemmed from her desire to convey, capture, and instill emotions that she previously couldn't do with words alone. Michelle's love for visual imagery began with her exploration of photography, which gradually grew into an interest in cinematography.

With a Bachelor of Fine Arts degree in cinematography from Emerson College, Michelle has shot a wide range of content that include two feature films, commercials for clients such as Intel, short films, music videos



and web series. Her work has garnered accolades and screened in film festivals around the country, including her college thesis film, "Inside Boxes," being chosen as finalist for the 2016 Cannes Short Film Corner. Michelle is a proud member of the International Collective of Female Cinematographers (ICFC), Society of Camera Operators, and the AFI Cinematography Intensive for Women Class of 2019. She hopes to continue growing as a director of photography and creative artist through collaboration.

DOUGLAS SMITH TANNER

Douglas can most recently be seen in Oliva Wilde's *Don't Worry Darling*. He also recently starred in the independent feature film *The Swearing Jar* directed by Lindsay Mackay which premiered at Toronto International Film Festival.

Prior to that, Douglas can be seen in season 2 of the hit HBO drama series, *Big Little Lies* playing opposite Shailene Woodley. Smith starred in Cary Fukunaga's TNT series, *The Alienist*, and reprised his role as Marcus Isaacson in the follow-up series *The Angel of Darkness*,



which premiered in 2020. His extensive resume includes leads in the Blumhouse/Universal feature *Ouija*; FOX 2000's *Percy Jackson: Sea of Monsters* opposite Logan Lerman, and Brandon Cronenberg's Antiviral, which premiered at Cannes. Douglas also recurred on the first season of Martin Scorsese's HBO series *Vinyl*.

He is perhaps best known, however, for his role as Ben Henrickson on HBO's critically acclaimed show *Big Love*, starring Bill Paxton and Chloe Sevigny.

MARGO HARSHMAN NICOLE

Margo Harshman is an American actress known for the roles of series regular Tawny Dean on *Even Stevens*, Sheldon Cooper's assistant Alex Jensen on *The Big Bang Theory*, and Timothy McGee's wife Delilah Fielding-McGee on *NCIS*.

In 2000, she was cast in the Disney Channel sitcom Even Stevens as Tawny Dean, the female best friend of series lead Louis. Harshman appeared in 47 episodes in the show's three-year run and reprised the role for the 2003 movie. Harshman also starred on the TV shows Run of the House and Center of the Universe, and her




film appearances include Sorority Row, College Road Trip and Fired Up!.

ABRAHAM RODRIGUEZ EZEKIEL



In his debut poetry collection, *mixed feelings*, Rodriguez writes about his backand-forth emotions of love and pain from his first experience of falling in love.

RYAN WHITNEY IZZY

Ryan Whitney started her professional career at the tender age of three in print and commercials. By six years old, she made her feature film debut alongside an all-star cast including Steve Buscemi and Maggie Gyllenhaal in Columbia Pictures *Monster House*, where she earned the distinction of being the youngest actor ever to be motion-captured. Shortly after, she starred alongside Tim Allen, Courteney Cox, Chevy Chase and Kate Mara in Sony Picture's *Zoom*. Ryan is known for her lead role in the Nick at Nite series *See Dad Run* as Emily Hobbs, the teenage daughter of Scott Baio,



and for the lead role of Ginger Falcone in the Disney XD series *Zeke and Luther*. She also frequented fan-favorites such as *Hannah Montana*, *Good Luck Charlie*, *Big Time Rush*, and *The Thundermans*, and movies such as *The Thinning* and *Alexander IRL*. After a hiatus to complete her B.A. in Psychology at UCLA, Ryan has filmed several movies including starring in the upcoming independent film, *Notes*, as well as the Ronald Reagan biopic, *Reagan*, where she plays his first love, Margaret Cleaver.


