




SYNOPSIS

Inside a working class home in 90's America, eight year old Charlie wants nothing more than to be a superhero. Her overworked parents are drifting apart, and their arguments just keep getting worse. Charlie's only escape is her dream of being super. Eventually, the toxicity around the house boils over, and Charlie watches as her mother throws a frying pan at her father. BAM! Charlie freezes time, her arms outstretched in a gesture of protest. She has finally unlocked her super power! Instinctively, Charlie discovers that she can not only stop time, but turn it back. Immediately, Charlie turns back time just before her parents' most recent fight and tries to avert it through her innocent, eight-year-old diplomacy.

What unfolds is Charlie's growth to realizing that her powers may not be the solution to solving the problems of her broken home, but rather the answer to finding her strength to rise above hardship that lies within herself.



CHARLIE

CHARACTER DESCRIPTION

Charlie is a creative and imaginative young girl in the 90s who wishes to emulate the superheroes she watches on TV and have superpower of her own. Witnessing intense and violent fights between her parents at home motivates her childlike innocence and unconditional familial love to alleviate the animosity. Initially feeling alone and powerless to do anything herself, she develops the superpowers she longed for and finds she can freeze and rewind time to get what she wants. By using and understanding her superpowers, she realizes her inner strength to rise above her broken household, concluding that she is not the one responsible for her parents' relationship.



DAD (JEFF) CHARACTER DESCRIPTION

Jeff is Charlie's father and Meg's husband. He seems largely disconnected from his relationship with Meg as most of their conversations end in a fight or him feeling like he's never doing enough/measuring up to her standards. His relationship with Charlie, while friendly and infused with fatherly love (nicknames like "kiddo" and "sweetie"), is somewhat by the wayside, most likely a result of his strained marriage and having to work and run errands.



Meg is the mother of Charlie, a young and imaginative girl, and the wife to Jeff, a clueless and unobservant husband. She is quick to anger to the point where it seems she starts fights just for the sake of having them. She is not averse to escalating to physical violence to "win" or get her way. She seems largely unconcerned with her daughter unless she is harping on her to clean or to chastise her. She has a need for control and somewhat arbitrary order in the way she deems to her standards.

MOM (MEG) **CHARACTER DESCRIPTION**

THE TONE OF "THE PHOENIX"

The tone of The Phoenix encapsulates feelings of childhood innocence and curiosity in a coming of age story about resilience in the face of adversity at home. While Charlie represents a character that we all once were, an innocent and imaginative child, she is also an exemplar of the untapped strength inside all of us. Charlie's journey encourages us to let go of guilt from childhood trauma and pave a healthier and happy future.




THE WORLD OF "THE PHOENIX"

CHARACTER DESIGN FOR ORIGINAL ANIMATED CHARACTER

The Blue Phoenix is the lead character in the original 90s-style superhero cartoon that we created for the production. The cartoon plays on the television in the beginning of the film and inspires Charlie to take flight and strive for superpowers.



COLOR PALETTE

In the beginning, the palette is bright, superhero-esque primary colors.

During the parents' fight, the palette becomes more and more desaturated as Charlie turns back time, unable to stop the cycle.

The coloring stays very desaturated during the time jump to 2006. But, when the cartoon that inspired her as a girl comes on, it returns to full saturation. It's a beckoning light.
